



## Prader-Willi Syndrome Training Session Options

The Center's interdisciplinary team can share their expertise through various general non-patient specific training options via videoconference or at our facility in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

### Option 1: Interactive Videoconference

**\$500**

Session includes presentations by Behavioral, Nutrition, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech-Language Pathology presented via live video conference. Trainee's site must be equipped for videoconferencing.

### Option 2: On-site Training at The Children's Institute <sup>(1)</sup>

**\$750**

Session includes presentations by Behavioral, Nutrition, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech-Language Pathology presented in person at The Children's Institute. Continental breakfast provided.

### Option 3: On-site Training at The Children's Institute and Tour <sup>(1)(2)</sup>

**\$850**

Session includes presentations by Behavioral, Nutrition, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech-Language Pathology presented in person at The Children's Institute followed by a tour of the facility and the PWS hospital unit if unit activity permits. Continental breakfast provided.
